Title 1 Designation: What Does it Mean?

Title 1 is a designation by the US Department of Education. The program provides financial assistance to local educational agencies and schools with high numbers of children from low-income families, to help ensure that all children meet challenging state academic standards. PS 20 is a Title 1 school and receives assistance for enrichment programs and free or reduced student meals.

Title 1 Representative: What Are the Roles & Responsibilities?

Title I schools are required to include parents in the decision-making process regarding the Title I educational program.

Consultation with the School Leadership Team (SLT) regarding

- the Comprehensive Educational Plan (CEP)
- the Title 1 Parent Involvement Policy (PIP)
- the School Parent Compact (SPC)
- the use of Title 1 funding

Communication with Title 1 Parents to ensure that the views and opinions of the school's Title 1 parents are appropriately conveyed to the SLT.

How much time is required of a Title 1 Representative?

- monthly meeting with other District 1 Title 1 Reps (Time & Place TBD & based on availability TBD / possibility of video conferencing. About 1 hour)
- monthly SLT meetings (the last Tuesday of each month 5:15-6:30pm)
- varied time, depending on mediums used to obtain parent feedback (Oct-Feb)
